
Dear colleagues,


As you may have heard, our strike was successful insofar as UNBC's Administration has now agreed to enter into binding arbitration with us. We feel it is unlikely that they would have agreed to this - particularly in light of the BC government's historical antipathy to binding arbitration - had we not gone out on strike. It will now be some months before the arbitration hearings take place and an arbitrator's award is rendered. Nevertheless, we remain hopeful that we will receive a contract that brings us closer to sector norms.

Thanks again for your support during our strike, and know that we now stand with you in solidarity as we all work to maintain fair and reasonable working conditions for universities across Canada.
